Breast Cancer Screening

 Assesses women 50–74 years of age who had at least one mammogram to screen for breast cancer in the past two years.

How to improve your score

- Discuss the importance of breast cancer screening and ensure your patients are up to date on their mammogram.
- Document screening for breast cancer in your medical records and be sure to include date of screening and results.
- Document medical and surgical history of breasts.
- Let patients know that screenings are covered by FEP Benefits.

Codes

- Mammograms:

- Exclusions:
 - Bilateral Mastectomy any time during the members history:
 - Bilateral mastectomy
 - ICD-10 PCS: 0HTV0ZZ
 - Unilateral mastectomy with a bilateral modifier
 - **CPT**: 19180, 19200, 19220, 19240, 19303, 19304, 19305, 19306, 19307
 - Modifier: 50
 - Acquired absence of bilateral breast

- Combination of the codes below as proof of a mastectomy on both sides:
 - Left mastectomy
 - Unilateral mastectomy with a leftside modifier

 - Acquired absence of the left breast
 - ° ICD-10: Z90.12
 - · Left unilateral mastectomy

 - Right mastectomy
 - Unilateral mastectomy with a rightside modifier
 - CPT: 19180, 19200, 19220, 19240, 19303, 19304, 19305, 19306, 19307
 - Modifier: RT
 - Acquired absence of the right breast
 - ICD-10: Z90.11
 - · Right unilateral mastectomy
 - **ICD-10 PCS**: 0HTT0Z
- Hospice care or using hospice services during the measurement year
- Palliative care during the measurement year
