

# Appropriate Treatment for Upper Respiratory Infection (URI)

## Description of Measure

The percentage of episodes for members 3 months of age and older with a diagnosis of upper respiratory infection (URI) that did not result in an antibiotic dispensing event.<sup>1</sup>

The measure is reported as an inverted rate. A higher rate indicates appropriate URI treatment (i.e., the proportion of episodes that did not result in an antibiotic dispensing event.)

## Numerator Compliance

Dispensed prescription for an antibiotic medication from the AAB Antibiotic Medications List on or 3 days after the Episode Date.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Members who use hospice services) or elect to use a hospice benefit</li> <li>Members who have died</li> <li>Visits that result in an inpatient stay</li> </ul>	Any time during measurement year (MY)

<b>Strategies for Success</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>If a member tests negative for group A strep but insists on an antibiotic: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Refer to the illness as a sore throat due to a cold; members tend to associate the label with a less frequent need for antibiotics.</li> <li>Write a prescription for symptom relief, like over-the-counter medications</li> </ul> </li> <li>Educate members on the difference between bacterial vs viral infections.</li> <li>Avoid treating viral syndromes with antibiotics, even if they are requested</li> <li>Discuss with members ways to treat symptoms</li> </ul>
